ASSESSMENT

We are beginning our Standardised Testing after mid-term. This is in line with our Assessment Policy.

On Wednesday 2nd March:

- Senior Infants will be administered the MIST (Middle Infant Screening Test)
 - 1st and 4th Classes will be administered the NNRIT (New Non Reading Intelligence Test)
 - 2nd and 5th Classes will be administered the Drumcondra Spelling Test.

As with all standardised assesements, we advise against over-emphasising them with the children. This can create unnecessary anxiety. These assessments are only a snapshot of any child's ability and are used as a guide to help us support your child's education.
