Have your Say on the Review of School Transport Closing date is February 10



The Department of Education is in the process of conducting a review of the School Transport Scheme. The review encompasses the School Transport Scheme for Children with Special Educational Needs and the Primary and Post-Primary School Transport Schemes. The review is being conducted with a view to examining the current scheme, its broader effectiveness and sustainability and to ensure that it serves students and their families adequately. The review will examine the potential for integration of different strands of the scheme and a more coordinated approach with other Government Departments that also use transport services. It will also consider issues such as climate action, rural development and promoting where possible initiatives that encourage walking and cycling to school.

Coronavirus COVID-19



As the recent wave of Covid-19 seems to be subsiding and as government restrictions are being loosened, we ask that parents/guardians are as vigilant as ever when it comes to identifying symptoms in children. As communicated throughout the week, we are still receiving notifications of positive cases in many of the classes in the school. We have also had to ask parents to pick up their children from school who appear unwell. We ask you to act responsibly. If your child is in any way unwell before school, do not assume that it is "just a cold". Our motto has always been if a child is unwell before coming to school, please do not send them. We ask you to be vigilant and to protect your child, other children and school staff. Children who are unwell must be 48 hours symptom free before coming back to school and if they have symptoms of Covid-19, that antigen tests are done according to HSE guidance.
